Organized by the National Films Development Corporation of India (NFDC), the apex body of filmmaking in India, under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, MIFF remains a cornerstone of the Indian cultural landscape.

MIFF transcends borders, attracting entries from a vast array of countries, languages, and artistic styles. This creates a unique space for filmmakers and film enthusiasts to come together, share diverse perspectives, and explore exciting collaborative opportunities. It's a melting pot of creativity, fostering dialogue and exchange of ideas that fuel innovation within the filmmaking community.

The 18th MIFF has seen a record number of film submissions with 1018 entries from 38 countries across the globe.

The non-competition section has various curated packages like Oscar winning films, Berlinale shorts and curated films packages in Wildlife, Animation, Country Focus Films, Students Film & Special Screenings for the differently-abled. This year the festival will screen 8 World premieres, 6 International Premieres, 17 Asia Premieres and 15 Indian Premieres.

MORE THAN JUST SCREENINGS

MIFF offers a rich and engaging experience beyond the red carpet and screenings. Specially curated programs like country focuses, retrospectives, tributes, and selections of award-winning and student films provide a diverse cinematic journey. To further ignite discourse, MIFF organizes workshops, masterclasses, panels, and open forums. Listen to world class experts such as Ritchie Mehta, director of Delhi Crime and Poacher, Oscar nominated Artist Nemil Shah, Dr. Talakadu Srinivasaiah Nagabharana, 7-time National Award winner and more. These sessions delve into the evolving landscape of filmmaking, exploring themes of social change, technological advancements, and the ever-changing art of storytelling. Industry meets are also facilitated, fostering connections and collaborations in film production and distribution.

The prestigious MIFF is hosting its first-ever Docu-Film Bazaar, a three-day event from June 16th to 18th designed to give filmmakers a chance to connect with industry experts, get invaluable feedback on their project, find international and national buyers and propel their films onto the global stage. Whether a project is in pre-production, knee-deep in editing, or ready to showcase your finished masterpiece, the Bazaar has something for everyone.
